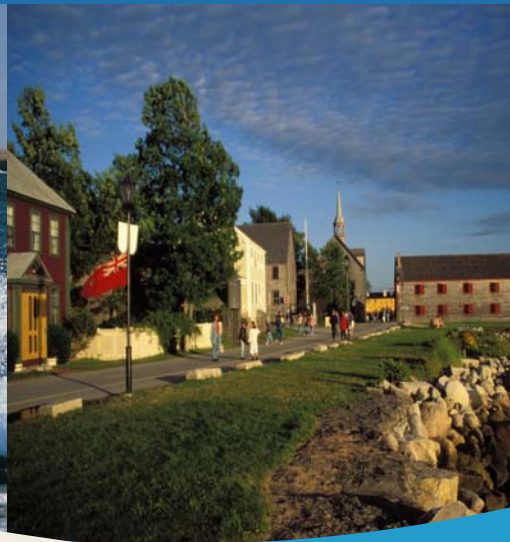

## International Trauma Life Support (ITLS) Course

This course is intended to make trauma physicians functional in EDE as quickly as possible. It is limited to the key indications recognized as being most appropriate for Trauma EDE. The times allotted to the different segments reflect the relative difficulty of the skills involved. Upon completion of the curriculum detailed below, a trauma physician will be able to participate in ultrasound examinations of trauma patients under the supervision of a colleague certified as an EDE Instructor. The course takes place over a single day (0800-1800), making it more practical for busy physicians to attend and reducing costs involved. Topics covered include the physics of ultrasound, understanding ultrasound images, cardiac EDE, vascular access EDE, abdominal EDE, and thoracic EDE.
