CRITICAL CARE SERVICES

ER/LifeFlight

St. Mary's Emergency Room provides medical attention by doctors that are board certified in various specialties including Emergency Medicine. The Level II Trauma Center is open 24/7 with three Trauma Surgeons on staff. LifeFlight, the helicopter ambulance and elite critical care team, provides advanced levels of emergency care and transports over 700 patients annually from Northern Minnesota and Northwestern Wisconsin. LifeFlight provides the region's only neonatal transport.

CORONARY INTENSIVE CARE UNIT

This nine-bed unit is where care is provided for acute cardiac patients, including those with cardiac arrest, cardiogenic shock and myocardial infarction. Diagnostic and treatment services may include angiogram, angioplasty, stent and electrophysiology.

MEDICAL INTENSIVE CARE UNIT

A nine-bed unit where care is provided to critical medical patients, including management and monitoring of vented patients, GI diseases, hemodialysis, drug overdoses, sepsis and multisystem failure. An interdisciplinary team provides care and support for patients and families.

NEUROTRAUMA INTENSIVE CARE UNIT

A 10-bed unit where intensive care is provided for critical neuro-medical, neuro-surgical and trauma patients.

NEUROTRAUMA INTERMEDIATE CARE UNIT

A six-bed unit for neuro-medical, neuro-surgical and trauma patients who require more intensive nursing care than can be provided on the neurotrauma unit but do not require intensive care monitoring.

SURGICAL INTENSIVE CARE UNIT

The 11-bed SICU provides care for cardiothoracic surgical, vascular surgical, high-risk urology and other surgical patients requiring intensive treatment and/or monitoring.

CARDIOVASCULAR INTERMEDIATE CARE UNIT

This 24-bed unit provides post-operative care for patients who have had cardiac, thoracic or vascular surgery. A multidisciplinary team training in the specifics of cardiac disease cares for patients.

SHORT STAY CORONARY UNIT

This 12-bed unit is where care is provided for patients having an angiogram, angioplasty, stent, or electrophysiology procedure on a potential outpatient basis. Patients are admitted the day of their procedure and discharged the same or the next day.

POST CORONARY CARE UNIT

The 33-bed PCCU provides care for patients with a wide range of medical and surgical cardiac-related illnesses. Continuous cardiac monitoring is available. This includes a five-bed outpatient chest pain unit for patient evaluation.

SURGICAL SERVICES

ORTHOPAEDICS AND UROLOGY

This 30-bed unit provides pre- and post-operative care for orthopaedic and urology surgical patients.

GENERAL SURGERY

The 27-bed surgery unit provides care for adult patients having general surgery. A multi-disciplinary approach is taken for these surgical procedure patients.

OPERATING ROOM

There are 18 state-of-the-art operating rooms, including 1 Endovascular Suite, a Neurointerventional Suite and two operating rooms dedicated solely to the Birthplace. From laparoscopic surgery and stereotactic imaging to robotic-assisted da Vinci surgical systems, these advanced technologies are performed by experience, board-certified surgeons.

CHILDREN AND WOMEN'S SERVICES

BIRTHPLACE

The Birthplace provides both routine and high-risk obstetrical care for pregnant women, newborns and women having gynecological procedures. The unit consists of 16 LDRP rooms, 10 antepartum rooms, triage area, newborn nursery and two delivery rooms/surgical suites.

NEONATAL INTENSIVE CARE UNIT

A 25-bed NICU is for newborns requiring intensive care for prematurity or other special medical conditions.

PEDIATRICS / PEDIATRIC INTENSIVE CARE UNIT

Both the 17-bed general pediatric unit and six-bed PICU offer care for children from birth through age 17. Inpatients, outpatients and children requiring intensive care are provided with a wide range of medical, surgical and trauma services.

MEDICAL CARE AREAS

CARE INITIATION UNIT

This area is designated to initiate care for patients being admitted to St. Mary's Medical Center from the regional clinics and emergency departments when an inpatient bed is not immediately available.

MEDICAL UNIT

This level 3B, 30-bed unit is for patients with an array of general medical conditions, including respiratory and gastrointestinal diseases. Family practice medical residents attend patients under the supervision of teaching physicians.

HOSPICE INPATIENT UNIT

Our six-bed short-stay hospice unit is for general inpatient care and respite care, provided by an interdisciplinary hospice team including a chaplain, social worker, nurses, volunteers and physicians.

ONCOLOGY

St. Mary's 26-bed Adult Medical Oncology Unit is for patients with cancer. Many of the registered nurses on the unit are Nationally Certified Oncology Nurses. A chaplain, social worker and oncology clinician support the unit.
